School extension

After over five years of planning and numerous Covid-related delays, we are thrilled that work is finally underway on our much-needed school extension. The two-storey addition will provide one extra mainstream classroom and four special education rooms. The extra space and facilities will be an invaluable resource to our whole school community. On completion of the building works, we plan to remove the existing prefab classrooms and redevelop the Junior playground.

Ensuring the safety of the children remains our priority during the building works and while there is obviously some unavoidable noise and disruption, we are doing our utmost to keep it an absolute minimum during the school day. Although, for some of the younger members of our school community, the arrival of diggers to the school yard has caused a real stir of excitement and the construction team is being very closely watched and monitored during break times.

All going well, the project is scheduled to finish in the autumn. We'll share regular updates throughout, so keep an eye on Twitter to follow our progress.
