They have delivered our solar panels and took the time to meet with Fourth Class and discuss all the different ways we can continue to help reduce the school's carbon footprint. At Guardian Angels, all pupils are involved in the Green Schools Programme across a wide range of initiatives. We have dedicated energy monitors who patrol the school to ensure no energy is wasted. Water watchers keep an eye on our taps and make sure they are never left running. We recycle, compost and have weekly clean-ups. Thermostats have been added to heaters and Mecon switches installed on toilets. Our 'switch it off' campaign – also run by the pupils – makes sure all lights and devices are switched off when not in use.

Friends of the Earth were so impressed by all the effort our GANS pupils make as part of the Green Schools Programme and we look forward to the panels being installed early in the new year.
