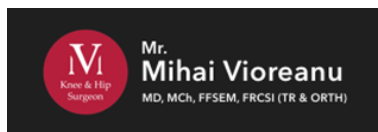
Our secretary Cathy would like to extend her heartfelt gratitude for the many kind messages of support and sympathy she received on the recent loss of her sister Delia.
